Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I hope you all had a couple of relaxing long weekends and the opportunity to enjoy some valuable family time together. I am excited to be Acting Principal at Caboolture East State School and honoured to have the opportunity to work with staff, students, parents and community during the next 8 weeks. I am looking forward to continuing the great work Mrs Wilson has established at our wonderful school with students, teachers and families. Working together with the leadership team and staff at Caboolture East State School, I hope to inspire students and support them in their endeavours to achieve academic, sporting, cultural and personal goals.

I have been visiting classrooms over the last week and have been noticing the exciting and wonderful things happening and the students' engagement and enjoyment in learning. When students are engaged in their learning they are making decisions and developing skills that will accompany them into adulthood and help them to achieve their goals. Another important factor in student achievement is attendance. When students miss a day of school they are missing out on learning a number of important fundamental skills. AUTISM AWARENESS

(April was Autism awareness month)

Continuing on from the previous newsletter, some of the Teaching Strategies used to support students with ASD at Caboolture East State School are described below:

1 **COMMUNICATION:**

- offering a variety of alternative communication modes eg photos, line drawings, symbols
- reinforcing messages with visual information
- Understanding that disruptive behaviours often have a communication function such as indication feeling or need
- Ensuring the student is attending before talking to them
- Minimising distraction. (Students with ASD have difficulty processing information and picking out relevant cues from irrelevant ones.)

2 SOCIAL IMPAIRMENT:

- Use the student's chosen high interest topics to assist with learning and motivation
- linking behaviour management and social learning to the curriculum
- Promoting social learning through natural interactions and opportunities throughout the day.

3 RIGIDITY AND INFLEXIBILITY:

Rigid and inflexible behaviours often are the result of students with ASD preferring to have structure and predictability in all areas of their lives. If routines are disrupted, there may be an intense emotional reaction, which could be misinterpreted as tantrum but is really more like a panic attack caused by anxiety and stress.

Teachers may use some of the following teaching strategies:

- Allowing students to indulge in repetitive actions but only as a reward for doing prescribed tasks, e.g. use of trampoline
- Teaching the student with ASD to cope with change by preparing them in advance and offering explanation and support
- Designing programs which encourage more acceptable actions and better means of coping with stress, anxiety and tiredness eg I need a break card
- Encouraging students to engage in alternative and more socially acceptable activities-modelling /roleplaying alternatives
- Using the key interest areas as a basis for academic skills.
