Collection of Data**  
School Students with Disability

**NATIONAL CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA ON SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH DISABILITY:** 2015 was the first year that the NCCD was mandatory for all Australian schools. Federal Minister for Education, Christopher Pyne, recently stated that, from 2016, this data will be used to inform school funding for students with disabilities.

The aim of this information will help teachers, principals and families to better support students with disability to take part in school on the same basis as all students. This data will provide an opportunity for schools to review their support systems and processes in order to improve the learning outcomes of students with disability

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is essential. Personal details such as student names and other identifying information will **NOT be provided to Local or Federal authorities**



# Sun Safe News.....



As we get underway with a new school year, we would like to remind parents of the importance of your child having a hat. Childhood and adolescence are critical periods during which sun exposure is likely to contribute to skin cancer in later life. Schools have a duty of care to ensure that their students are protected against foreseeable harm. Sunburn and skin cancer are foreseeable outcomes of overexposure to the sun.

It is for this reason that we have a firm Sun Safe Policy within the school to protect our students. An integral part of this policy requires students to wear a hat when outdoors.

The school has a reversible bucket hat with the school colours and emblem embroidered on the outside and school sports house name and colour on the inside. Initially this hat is given (free of charge) upon enrolment, thereafter it can be purchased from the Tuckshop – Monday to Friday for \$15.00.
