Student Attendance

A reminder to parents that students are required to be at school and in their classrooms ready to learn when the 8:45am bell rings. Staff will be marking their rolls at 8.50am and any students not here will be marked absent. If your child is arriving after this time they are required to present at the office in order to obtain a late slip and be marked accordingly. Any students who present to the classroom after 8:50am will be sent by their teacher to the office for a late slip.

Student attendance continues to be a focus for our school. When students miss part of a day or a day of school they are missing out on learning a number of important fundamental skills. Ensuring your child is at school gives them the best opportunity to achieve their goals. Children arriving 10 to 15 minutes late everyday are missing out on important information and valuable learning time. Often the first part of the day involves explicit instruction around key learning areas.

Winter Uniforms

With winter coming many of our students are arriving at school with a variety of jumpers and jackets with hoods. These jumpers and jackets are not part of the school uniform. It is important for all students to be properly dressed in full school uniform. Can we encourage you to purchase the correct school jumper or jacket from the uniform shop. They are available in a variety of sizes

Guideposts for raising your child's self-esteem

As parents, we only want the best for our children. We want them to be confident and self-loving people. Our children model after our actions, not just our words. We can't tell them one thing and act the opposite. We need to be leading by example, setting boundaries and establishing high expectations.

Dr Wayne W Dyer outlines seven principles that you can use as guideposts for raising your child's self-esteem.

1. You must model self-respect. Just as you must provide an example of a person with positive self-image, you must also show your child through behaviour, that you respect yourself and are entitled therefore to be treated respectfully.
2. Treat each child as a unique individual. Each of your children is a special person not like their brothers or sisters, or any other person with whom you might compare them.
3. A child is not his/her actions. He/she is a person who acts. You can teach your child to grow from mistakes and to never fear failure as long as he/she understands that his/her worth does not come from how well he/she performs a given task on a particular day.
4. Provide opportunities to be responsible and make decisions. Children with high self-esteem are those who are given the opportunity to be decision-makers right from the very beginning of their lives.
5. Teach enjoyment of life each day. Children who live in a positive environment learn to be positive about themselves.
6. Provide praise rather than criticism. Children who are criticized learn to do the same thing to themselves, and ultimately become persons with low self-regard. Praise is a wonderful tool in the entire process of child rearing.
7. We become what we think about: Our thinking determines our self-image, which in turn determines our feelings and our behaviour. Keep in mind that your children from the earliest moments of existence have thoughts that are shaped by your input.

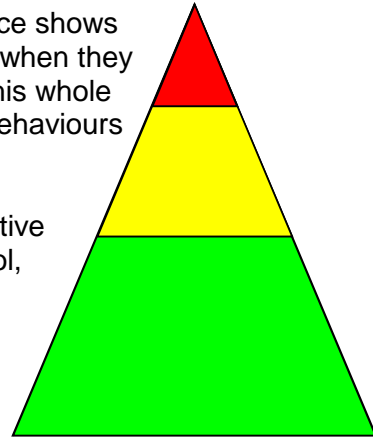
Here at Caboolture East State School, we use restorative practices guided by a whole school Positive Behaviour for Learning framework, called PBL for short.

PBL is a whole school process of explicit teaching of behaviour expectations, and acknowledging positive behaviour and correcting negative behaviour, all to work towards improving the learning outcomes for our students.

These explicit lessons are taught and reviewed each week in every classroom. Evidence shows that students respond positively to acknowledgments, rewards, praise and corrections when they have been taught and explicitly shown what is expected of behaviour at our school. This whole school approach implemented by all staff gives students a sense of ownership in the behaviours they choose.

The Positive Behaviour for Learning framework is being successfully implemented across many schools in Queensland, with the intention of increasing positive behaviours and reducing challenging behaviours. Here at Caboolture East State School, successful and positive results are being achieved.

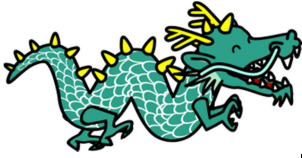
